**Level 5 Applied Social Studies Award
Part-time 2015-2016**



Students wishing to obtain the Applied Social Studies Award may do so by attending part-time classes over two years. Students will be expected to attend college two days per week and find a work placement for a third day. Students study four modules each year.

Starting date for this course is the 14th September 2015.

The modules on offer this year are as follows:

1. Substance Use – Issues for Youth Workers – 5N2176

Having studied this module learners should have the knowledge, skill and competence to work safely and effectively as part of a team in youth and community work settings where the population have been negatively affected by substance use.

Units of study

- Identify the different types and legal status of a range of substances
- The contexts in which contribute to young people engaging in substance use
- Examine a range of strategies which focus on initiatives and responses to young people's substance use

2. Psychology – 5N0754

This module introduces learners to psychological perspectives, psychology as a science and psychological disorders.

Units of Study

- Psychological perspectives and therapeutic interventions
Relating perspectives to the understanding of the individual and their beliefs and attitudes
- Apply skills/ knowledge to typical work based problems

3. Work Experience – 5N1356

Learners will get their opportunity to prepare relevant work experience material and to participate effectively in work experience which students will need to organise for one day a week. Work Experience skills will include observing good time-keeping, communicating with colleagues and working independently while under direction.

Units of study

- Examine work organisations and personal career opportunities in a particular vocational area
- Explore options for future education, training and employment in light of work experience

4. Intercultural Studies – 5N0765

The aim of this module is to equip the learner with the knowledge, skills and competence to explore, reflect on and analyse intercultural issues.

Units of study

- Culture and Society
- Popular Culture
- Exploring Intercultural Issues – Research and Development
